Further Vocational Qualification in Information and Communication Technology

Profile of skills and competences

Composition of the qualification

The scope of the further vocational qualification in information and communication technology is 150 competence points. The qualification is composed of a compulsory unit (30 competence points) and two optional units (120 competence points).

Vocational skills and competences required for completion of the qualification

The competence of the holder of the further vocational qualification in information and communication technology varies depending on the selected units. Candidates, who have selected the:

- **Software design** –unit, are able to assess the customer's needs and design interfaces, usability, data structures, and software architecture together with the customer and a team
- Software implementation, testing, and commissioning –unit are able to nalyse specifications and draw up a project plan as well as carry out the software implementation and its testing.
- Working in server and workstation support –unit are able to manage an acquisition process, install hardware and software, and maintain hardware.
- Working in communication network support —unit are able to document a communication network and install and maintain a local area network.
- Working in application and advisory service support —unit know how to plan information and communication technology services as well as guide or educate users.

Holders of the further vocational qualification in information and communication technology may use the qualification title datanomi (FQ).

Range of occupations accessible to the holder of the certificate

Holders of the further vocational qualification in information and communication technology may work in service, expert, or customer support tasks with external or internal clients in the information and communication technology sector and organisations supporting them.

Official basis of the certificate

Name and status of the body awarding the certificate

An education provider with an authorisation to provide education and award qualifications granted by the Ministry of Education and Culture.

Officially recognised ways of obtaining the certificate

The vocational skills required for completing the modules are demonstrated by performing practical tasks in authentic situations and work processes (demonstration of knowledge and skills). The student's knowledge and skills are assessed diversely by a teacher and a working life representative and compared to the competence defined in the qualification requirements. The education provider awards the student a qualification certificate once the qualification has been completed acceptably in accordance to the qualification requirements laid down by the Finnish National Agency for Education.

Entry requirements

No formal qualifications are required to take the competence test.
