Profile of skills and competences

Composition of the qualification

The specialist vocational qualification in product development (180 competence points) is composed of compulsory units (90 competence points) and optional units (45 competence points). The compulsory unit is Proactive development (90 competence points). The optional units are Building a brand (45 competence points), Productisation in product development work (45 competence points), Service design in product development work (45 competence points), and Working as an innovator (45 competence points). It is also possible to take a unit from another further or specialist vocational qualification as an optional unit (45 competence points).

Vocational skills and competences required for completion of the qualification

Holders of the specialist vocational qualification in product development knows how to refine and develop the products, services, or operating models in their sector. They know the steps of a developmental process. Based on the units they have selected, the qualification holder knows how to take a customer-based approach to shaping product development work, productise it for the market, and build a functional brand around it. They have the ability to readily utilise new tools and methods, perform quick and agile experiments as well as work as a part of a development team. Holders of the specialist vocational qualification in product development showcases the thinking of a developer acting as an innovator in their organisation.

Range of occupations accessible to the holder of the certificate

Regardless of sector, holders of the specialist vocational qualification in product development work in tasks offering the opportunity and authority to conceive, plan, and implement product development projects with a development team. Product development work refers to developing a product, a service, or a operating model. In product development work, it is important to produce a new product, service, or operating model. Qualification holders may work either in the private or the public sector.

Officially recognised ways of obtaining the certificate

The vocational skills required for completing the modules are demonstrated by performing practical tasks in authentic situations and work processes (demonstration of knowledge and skills). The student's knowledge and skills are assessed diversely by a teacher and a working life representative and compared to the competence defined in the qualification requirements. The education provider awards the student a qualification certificate once the qualification has been completed acceptably in accordance to the qualification requirements laid down by the Finnish National Agency for Education.

Entry requirements

No formal qualifications are required to take the competence test.
